Constantin Papakostas 78, of Fort Myers, FL passed away on Sunday, May 1, 2022. He was born on October 3, 1943, in Kalamata, Greece, a son of the late Nicholas and Anastasia (Tanga) Papakostas. He had been a resident of Fort Myers since 2009 having moved from Riverdale, NY.

Constantin served in the Greek Navy and then became a professional soccer player (playing center back position) for the Olympiakos soccer team. He completed his education in Greece and upon moving to New York, Constantin worked in the hospitality industry. He worked as a restaurant manager for many Greek restaurants and diners and was a master butcher. He also worked at the Waldorf Astoria for over 10 years as the director of food inspection. Constantin was a member of the Doxa Soccer Club in New York.
