Edmund J. "Ed" Schick, 76, of Estero, FL passed away Saturday, May 2, 2020 at his residence. Formerly of Brighton, MI he began wintering in Bonita Springs in 1995, moving permanently in 2000 before relocating to Estero 6 years ago. Ed was born November 5, 1943 in Detroit, MI the son of the late Edmund J. and Margaret (O'Gorman) Schick.

Mr. Schick was a veteran of the United States Army.

He attended Henry Ford College before taking the position of Assistant Buyer at the J.L. Hudson Company in Detroit. Ed then established ESCO Industries Inc., an automotive manufacturing company in Brighton. In Bonita Springs, he owned and operated JE-MED, a medical supplies store and was currently the manager of the First Presbyterian Church Book Center.

Ed was a Michigan sports enthusiast who enjoyed cheering for the Detroit Tigers, Red Wings and Lions. He was also an avid golfer and loved reading.

Ed is survived by his beloved wife of 52 years, Ann H. (Segura) Schick; and many friends.
