Gregory Swift, 66 of Estero, Florida, passed away Tuesday, April 19, 2022.

Greg was born in Boulder, Colorado, the oldest of three children. The family moved to California while he was still young, then later to St. Louis. He attended one year of high school in England, and after graduation worked at a school in rural Kentucky, doing everything from teaching to driving the bus over mountain roads and creek beds to pick up students. He obtained his Bachelor's Degree from Pomona College and a Masters from Washington University. He lived in both Annecy and Paris, France, and spent most of his career working in Information Technology in Washington, DC. He retired from the National Gallery of Art in 2015 and moved to Estero to help take care of his in-laws in 2016. Although diagnosed with leukemia that same year, he resumed his interest in running, and consistently achieved first place for his age group in a number of 5K races in the area. Survivors include his loving wife, Lyn A. Donaldson; sons from a previous marriage, Galen R. Swift of Washington, DC, and Jay B. (Lauren) Swift of Eatonville, Washington; mother-in-law, Jean Donaldson of Estero, Florida; brother Grant (Lynn) Swift of Lafayette, Colorado; and sister, Alison (Don)McCormack of Boulder, Colorado.

Greg was a gentle, loving, and insightful person who was devoted to his family, and consistently promoted the value of integrity, science, and nature.
