Philip M. Allweiss, 60, of Highland, MI passed away Monday, May 3, 2021 at his winter residence in Bonita Springs, FL. He had been a seasonal resident of Bonita Springs since 1999. Phil was born February 20, 1961 in Detroit, MI a son of Salek and Frieda (Schiller) Allweiss.

In 1974 at the age of 13, Phil began working at Sol's Complete Car Care in Berkley, MI, his father's repair shop that was established in 1968. After high school, he graduated from Technical School and became a Master Mechanic. Phil took over the family business in 1987 and it is still operational today.

Survivors include his wife Kathryn "Kat" Allweiss; mother, Frieda Allweiss of Scottsdale, AZ; brothers, Ben Allweiss of Scottsdale, AZ and Jack (Patty) Allweiss of Mission Viejo, CA; sister, Ilana Moss of OR; nephew, Jonathan Allweiss; and niece, Erin Moss Lietzan. He is preceded in death by his daughter, Sara Sophia and his father, Salek Allweiss.


