August 21, 1947 - May 27, 2025

Allen R. Thompson, 77, of Bonita Springs, FL, passed away peacefully on May 27, 2025, in Naples, FL, following an extended illness.

Born on August 21, 1947, in Falmouth, Kentucky, Allen was the beloved son of the late Bernie C. and Marian J. (née Fox) Thompson. A proud patriot, Allen served his country with honor in the United States Army during the Vietnam War. After completing his military service, he furthered his education at Texas Central College in Fort Hood, Texas.
