Allison Ann Reeves, 54, of Darien, IL passed away peacefully on Sunday, February 22, 2015 at Joanne's House at Hope Hospice in Bonita Springs, FL. She enjoyed winter residency as a "snow bird" in Bonita Springs over the past 20 years. Allison was born September 26, 1960 in Joliet, IL a daughter of Howard E. and Colleen A. (Murphy) Reeves.

After graduating from St. Francis Academy, now Joliet Catholic Academy, in Joliet, IL, Allison earned her Bachelor's degree in Civil Engineering from the University of Illinois.

Allison earned the distinction of P.E. most recently working at Omega and Associates as Resident Engineer. Previously, she worked at Plote Construction Company as Quality Control Manager. She consulted on many prestigious road and bridge construction projects including the "Mile Long Bridge" on interstate I-294 and the I-355 South Extension spanning Des Plaines River Valley Bridge. As a female in construction she earned industry recognition and provided opportunities to many through her initiatives in diversity hiring. Candidates she hired into the Earned Credit Program obtained on the job training and often excelled at careers overcoming barriers to entry in construction careers.
