Betty M. Lundquist 88, devoted mother, died Friday, December 22, 2017 at American House in Bonita Springs, FL after an extended illness. She was born February 14, 1929 in Cookeville, TN, and was raised in Detroit, MI, the only daughter of the late Mark W. and Ruth (Bradley) Minor. A former resident of South Plainfield, NJ she had resided in Florida since 2010.

She earned her Bachelor's degree from Michigan State University (where she met her husband in freshman biology class), and for over 30 years worked for the YMCA in Plainfield, NJ as their administrator and bookkeeper. At the age of 60, she took up running; winning numerous age group awards. She retired in 1997, and was a snowbird until permanently taking up residence at her home in Spring Hill, FL in 2010. She was an avid and competitive tennis player and also loved golf, billiards, gardening and working on crossword puzzles. After reuniting with her high school friend, Margaret they traveled extensively throughout Europe, Asia, South America and Africa.

She is survived by her two daughters, Kathryn Lundquist and her husband, Philip Tell of Bonita Springs, FL and Elizabeth Lundquist of Littleton, CO and one granddaughter, Erica Powers also of Littleton, CO.

She was preceded in death by her parents and her husband, Robert Lundquist who died February 2, 1989.

A service for Betty is being planned for the spring at the Hillside Cemetery in Plainfield, NJ. She will be interred next to her husband, Robert.
