Carl Henry Geier, 82 of Naples, FL died Tuesday, August 15, 2017 at North Collier Hospital. He was born September 23, 1934 in Pittsburgh, PA, a son of the late Henry Geier and Elsa Lange Geier.

Carl served in the U.S. Army from 1957 to 1959. He then attended Carnegie Mellon University, in Pittsburgh, PA. On May 26, 1962, Carl married Marlene Gorski. In 1964 he started working as an engineer for Geo V. Hamilton, Inc., which is located in McKees Rocks, PA. As the years went on, Carl worked his way up the ladder and became the owner of the company. In 1994 he retired and became a snowbird. In 2000 Carl and Marlene became full time residents at Bonita Bay and then moved to Bentley Village in January, 2017.
