Charles S. "Charlie" Nothstine, 78, long time resident of Green Bay and later Naples Florida, died Sunday November 15. He was born July 1, 1937 in Columbus, OH, the son of Ralph and Neva (née Tinnerello) Nothstine.

Charlie was a veteran of the U.S. Navy. He spent his enlisted years at the Great Lakes Naval Base where he studied to be a dentist. He met Carol and they were married in 1959. He attended DePaul University in Chicago where he studied Business. They moved to Waukesha WI and lived there for 18 years. In 1977 Charlie became an owner of The Straubel Paper Company in Green Bay.
