



## Clarence Edward "Ed" Quandt

January 29, 1929 - August 17, 2024

Clarence Edward "Ed" Quandt, 95, of Bonita Springs, FL, died on August 17, 2024, at the Terraces at Bonita Springs after an extended illness. Formerly of West Milwaukee, WI, he had been a resident of Bonita Springs since 1984. He was born on January 19, 1929, in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, the son of the late Clarence C. and Mildred (Glish) Quandt. He was preceded in death by his parents and a daughter, Debra Jean Quandt.

After graduating high school, Ed enlisted in the U.S. Army and served his country from 1948 through 1952 during the Korean Conflict.

After returning home, Ed spent the next 34 years with the West Milwaukee Fire Department, serving as Fire Chief for the last 10 years of his career. After retiring, he moved to Bonita Springs, Florida, and began a second career with the Bonita Bay Club, where he spent 22 years as their Director of Building Maintenance. He permanently retired in 2007.

He is survived by his loving wife of 34 years, Judith Ann Quandt, of Bonita Springs, FL; son Joseph L. Quandt (Debbie Cope) of Mequon, WI; daughters Kymberley A. Gengler (the late Tim Gengler) of Hartford, WI, and Kelly M. Quandt (Dennis Jarvis) of West Bend, WI; grandson Paul Boeshaar (fiancé Annie Stanford); step-daughter Joy M. Hanawa (Michael) of Hawaii; and his step-grandsons Alex and Andy Hanawa.

Interment is planned at the Southern Wisconsin Veterans Memorial Cemetery in Union Grove, Wisconsin where private family services will be held.
