Donald C. Jensen, age 88, died peacefully on May 17, 2024. Don was born on August 21, 1935, in Oshkosh, Wisconsin to the parents of Ruth and Christian Jensen ... he was immensely proud of his Danish heritage from his father Christian who emigrated from Denmark. He grew up in Neenah, Wisconsin and graduated from St. Mary Central High School in Menasha, Wisconsin in 1953.
