Emily June Linzalone 87, of Estero, FL died Tuesday, September 29, 2015 at her residence after an extended illness. She was born June 28, 1928 in Passaic, NJ a daughter of the late John J. and Rose (née Grady) Harte. June had been a resident of Estero since 1972 coming from Lake Hopatcong, NJ.

She was a graduate of Pope Pius XII High School in Passaic, New Jersey. After graduation she married Joseph P. Linzalone, Sr. and in 1955 they opened their first business B & J Contractors in Lake Hopatcong, NJ. In 1972 they moved to Estero, FL and opened Estero Contractors Pool and Septic Service eventually changing the name to Estero Septic Services. The company today is operated by their son Cliff Linzalone.

She was a member of Our Lady of Light Catholic Community.

Survivors include her daughter, Donna Quelch (Richard) of Marco Island, FL and son, Cliff E. Linzalone (Rhonda) of Bonita Springs, FL; 7 grandchildren, Cyndi, Rick, Amy, Megan, Ashley, Anthony and Jolene and 11 great grandchildren. She was preceded in death by her husband, Joseph P. Linzalone, Sr. in 1993 and two sons, Daniel T. Linzalone and Joseph P. Linzalone, Jr.
