



Frank Newton McKean

September 17, 1940 - August 10, 2023

Frank N. McKean, 82, of Bonita Springs, FL went home to be with the Lord on Thursday, August 10th, 2023, at Life Care Center of Estero. Formerly of Edina, MN he had been a Bonita Springs resident since 1999.

He was born to Frank F. & Charlotte McKean in September 1940 in Grinnell, IA.

Frank grew up in Allison, IA and met his future wife Bonnie while they were both in the fifth grade when her one-room rural schoolhouse closed, and she started attending school in town. He and Bonnie graduated from Allison-Bristow High School in the same class. They married in 1962 and raised three children.

While in school, Frank assisted his father's medical practice by developing x-rays, providing a third hand to help with stiches, driving to medical emergencies and, on rare occasions, assisting with delivering babies.

He graduated from Macalester College in St. Paul, MN before earning a master's degree in business administration from the University of Iowa. His career in the banking business started in 1964 at Midland National Bank of Minneapolis and he retired from Wells Fargo as Vice President of Operations in 1999.

Mr. McKean was a member of First Presbyterian Church of Bonita Springs.

Among Frank's favorite pastimes was boating and fishing, in both Minnesota and Florida. The Bonita Bay Fishing Club honored him as an Outstanding Volunteer, and he taught children how to fish as part of the annual Friendship Fishing Day. He also served on the Board of the Bonita Bay Cruising Club.

Survivors include his loving children, son Frank C. (fiancée Sue Raddatz and children Lauren & Kyle Raddatz) McKean of Darien, IL; son Scott W. McKean of Anchorage, AK; daughter Karen S. Granquist of Crosslake, MN; and grandson Bobby Granquist. He was preceded in death by his wife of 58 years, Bonnie K. McKean; and brothers Charles T. McKean and John W. McKean.

A Celebration of Life will be held later. He will be laid to rest in the Resurrection Garden at First Presbyterian Church of Bonita Springs.
