George Robert Brown slipped away peacefully on the evening of April 2, 2020. George was born to Robert “Sonny” and Gertie Brown on October 8, 1932 in Maybrook NY. As a young man he was an accomplished baseball player, playing semi-pro with his father. George was accepted into New York Maritime Academy at Fort Skylar and went to sea as an engineer with American Export Lines upon graduation. After three years at sea and many Atlantic crossings, he went to work at GE where he finished his career as General Manager of GE Nuclear, retiring at age 60. George dearly loved his career with GE during which he visited 80 countries, often times traveling on the Concord between New York and London.

George began his Christian journey in earnest after attending, with his first wife’s encouragement, a 700 Club retreat in Virginia Beach where he accepted Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior. He took a few mission trips, Turkey and the Ukraine among them. His greatest ministry experience was preaching at the Collier County jail.

George was preceded in death by his parents, Robbie Brown (brother), and Janet Brown (first wife). He is survived by Carol Brown (wife), Carole (sister) and Ivan Jennings, and Curtis (brother) and Nita Brown.
