“ Even though Harvey and I both grew up on the north side of Indianapolis and were approximately the same age, we really didn't meet until our late 20's. As it turned out mutual friends introduced Harvey and Cheryl to my wife and me. We liked them immediately, how could you not, and developed a very good relationship w/them - - even vacationing together at their family place on Lake James, several times.

*Pretty quickly Harvey and I became, not just friends, but close friends This was understandable as we shared a number of interests; anything to do w/ lakes and rivers--especially fishing, IU basketball and football, books, history, humor--particularly sarcastic humor, politics. and most importantly--family. In essence I think it's fair to say--we bonded.*

*I was thus truly saddened when --several years later--Harvey informed me he and the family were moving permanently to Florida It was almost like losing a brother.*

*We did get together on a few occasions over the years, both up here and in Florida, and stayed in touch somewhat regularly by phone. In fact a small group of us were able to spend an evening with Harvey, here in Indianapolis, just this past summer--a couple of months before he died.*

*I've written all the above so that family and friends or, for that matter, anyone reading can get some sense of how extremely important Harvey's friendship, in spite of geographic challenges, has meant to me. But it is the following that in my estimation truly defines him and his worth*

*It seems to me that, for the most part, we as individuals tend to be shaped and influenced throughout life primarily by people older than we; of course parents, an uncle or aunt, grandparents certainly, maybe a high school coach or college teacher or two. Not so often a contemporary. For me, at least, Harvey is the clear exception.*

*Even though Harvey was a contemporary he was a significantly good influence in my life and not just because of the fun we had -- but how splendidly he lived. He was unfailingly principled, never straying from what he knew to be the right way to do things. He was proud-- not at all false pride --but a pride in his family, his heritage and in his personal conduct. He was completely honest--sometimes embarrassingly so --as he would be, never hurtful, but sometimes very candid and very direct. His dignity was so evident in many ways --but most vividly seen in the manor in which he fought his long and grueling bout with cancer. I never heard a single complaint from him, never To quote him--" it is what it is and we have to deal with it" As an aside, PLEASE don't think he was perfect--no way, and surely we all know that. And by the way I have some hilarious stories that clearly demonstrate those imperfections.*

*His wonderful friendship was a blessing to me and I miss him already.*
