



## Martin "Marty" John Barrett

Martin "Marty" John Barrett, age 90, passed away peacefully on December 9, 2025 surrounded by loved ones. Marty was born on April 18, 1935 in Brooklyn, New York to Catherine (Shannon) and Patrick J. Barrett. He was preceded in death by his first wife, Phyllis (Bollaert); his parents, siblings, grandson Vincent Gagliardi, Jr. and son-in-law Vincent Gagliardi. During their 25-year marriage, they lived a wonderful life at both Hunters Ridge Golfing Community and the last 15 years at Vi at Bentley Village. He was a member of the Saturday morning "No Name Club", volunteer at the Bentley Thrift Shop, Men's Golf, Couples Golf, "Waterboy",

and even had the opportunity to participate in the Veteran's Honor Flight to Washington D.C. with fellow Veterans of Bentley Village.
