



## Monty Hamer Robson

April 24, 1939 - August 13, 2017

Monty Hamer Robson, 78, of Bonita Springs, FL, passed away on Sunday, August 13, 2017, surrounded by his wife and all of his children. He was born in Wichita on April 24, 1939, the son of Mendon Frederick and Vivian Robson. He lived in Bonita Springs for the past 10 years.

Monty is survived by his loving wife of 53 years, Sally A. (Karn) Robson; his beloved children, Candace (Kenneth) Stultz of Wichita, KS, Marc (Beth) Robson of Kansas City, KS, John (Debbie) Robson of Tulsa, OK and Dr. Stu (Jennifer) Robson of St. Louis, MO; and ten cherished grandchildren.

Monty graduated from the University of Kansas with a Bachelor of Arts in Architectural Design in 1962. He started his own firm in Wichita, Robson Kuhnel and Spangenberg. He left a big impact on many building projects including winning several local and national awards. Monty strongly valued community involvement and was active in various organizations including the arts, Wichita Wagon Masters, and the American Institute of Architects. He was later honored to be the director of downtown redevelopment in Wichita. His work has touched many lives and will live on through his architectural achievements. He was very involved in his church serving as an elder at the First Presbyterian Church in Bonita Springs. He always thought of himself last and was loved by all the people he touched.

A memorial service will be held Friday, August 18, 2017 at 11:00 a.m. at the First Presbyterian Church of Bonita Springs, 9751 Bonita Beach Road. There will be a reception immediately following at the church in which Monty's favorite dessert, apple pie, will be enjoyed by all. Monty will be laid to rest in the church's Resurrection Garden.
