



Paul Hopewood

March 25, 1927 - December 24, 2014

Paul “Hoot” Hopewood, 87, of Naples, FL, died Wednesday, December 24, 2014. Formerly of Falmouth Heights, MA, he had been a Naples resident for the last 14 years. He was born March 25, 1927 in New York City, the son of Paul and Mary (née Pasqual) Hopewood.

He was a veteran of World War II, serving honorably with the 281st Combat Engineers, attached to the 3rd Army. He earned an Associate’s Degree from Paul Smith’s College in 1950 and attended NC State in Raleigh. Paul spent half of his career as a Vice President of a USG distributor in New York City and the balance of it as Regional Manager for Louverdrape Inc. in Dedham, MA. Paul was the epitome of Tom Brokaw’s The Greatest Generation.

Paul and his family were seasonal residents of Falmouth Heights for many years and made it their home in 1976. In 2005, he moved to Quail Village in Naples, often remarking “How lucky can a guy be?”.

Paul is survived by his loving wife of 21 years, Barbara Lou (née Homer); his beloved children, Peter Hopewood, Jane Hopewood and Carolyn Carroll; twenty-two grandchildren and eight great grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his first wife, Joan Barbara (née Guinta) in 1990.

Funeral services were held in Massachusetts and burial with Military Honors took place at the Massachusetts National Cemetery.

A memorial mass will be celebrated Thursday, January 22, 2015 at 11:00 a.m. at St. Agnes Catholic Church, 7775 Vanderbilt Beach Rd., Naples. A reception will follow at Quail Village.

In lieu of flowers, the family suggests that memorial contributions be made to St. Thomas Chapel in the care of St. Patrick's Church, Falmouth MA.
