She shared recently that she had a wonderful, full life with no regrets and that she was blessed to have the Lord Jesus Christ carry her through the joys and the heartaches. Peggy was preceded in death by her parents Leonard

and Mary as well as Bill, Gilbert, Andre and her granddaughter Meredith Joyce. She is survived by her son Leonard Joyce and daughter Jennifer Schmieding as well as four grandchildren Bill Joyce Jr. (Guna) Michael Schmieding, Matthew Schmieding, and Scott Schmieding (Sanya) and three great grandchildren Juniper, Julian, and Madison. “ I first met Peggy and her family when we were neighbors during my elementary school years. Mrs. Joyce was always nice and extended hospitality and friendship to my family.
