Robert L. "Bob" Coughlin, 84, of Fort Myers, FL passed peacefully on Friday, February 17, 2017 at The Lodge at Cypress Cove. Formerly of Wellesley, MA he also resided in Marco Island and Naples, FL before relocating to Fort Myers in 2007. Bob was born January 12, 1933 in Wellesley, MA a son of the late Richard and Ellen (McGrath) Coughlin.

Bob married Marion R. (Masucci) on October 29, 1955. He attended Massachusetts Maritime Academy and founded Coughlin Plumbing and Heating in 1957, retiring in 1992. In Wellesley, he was an active Little League and youth sports coach as well as a dedicated dad and fan.
