November 4, 1939 - February 15, 2018

Sidney Delbert Jewell, 78, of Bonita Springs, FL, passed away on Thursday, February 15, 2018. Formerly of McLean, VA, he had been a Bonita Springs resident for the last 20 years. He was born November 4, 1939 in Loudoun County, VA, the son of Eunice Elizabeth (Kitts-Jewell) and Aldridge Jewell. He served in the US Air Force from 1959 to 1963.
