Thomas Eugene Reynolds 64, of Naples, FL passed away on Monday, January 13, 2014 at his residence. Tom was born in Fort Worth, TX on June 24, 1949 to the late Thomas and Martha (Kelly) Reynolds, Jr.

After graduating from Bishop Lynch High School in Dallas, he studied at Providence College and the University of Toronto, where he received a master's degree in Political Science.

He was a long time employee of Sunshine Ace Hardware in Naples, and was well known and respected in the Naples and Marco Island area fishing community as a highly knowledgeable fishing tackle specialist.

Survivors include one brother, Chris Reynolds and spouse Linda of Wilsonville, Oregon; two sisters, Teresa McKee and spouse Tom of Rockwall, Texas and Lynne Glover and spouse Gil of Dallas, Texas; seven nieces and nephews and four great-nieces and nephews; and Dustin DeMilt, who Tom raised as his son.
