



Thomas Riscinti

February 10, 1963 - December 28, 2023

Tommy Riscinti, aka “Rocco” by some neighbors and friends, was a generous and kind soul who would give you the shirt off his back. Tommy particularly loved being outdoors and tending to his beautifully landscaped yard, while his beloved dog and companion Daisey would watch over him.

Thomas Riscinti, age 60, of Bonita Springs, FL, died at home on December 28, 2023. He was born on February 10, 1963, in Elizabeth, NJ to Rocco Riscinti and Filomena (Florence) DeFilippo Riscinti. Tommy adored his parents and was the youngest of four sons. He graduated from Union Catholic High School in Scotch Plains, NJ. Tommy was a medal-winning equestrian in his young years, and he owned a beloved horse named Badger Lightfoot. Tommy was employed by Chubb and Sons in the 1980s as well as working for the DMV and ran his own business selling sawdust for use as bedding in horse stables.

Tommy is survived by his brother Michael (Mae) Riscinti of Dilwyn, VA, his brother Joseph Riscinti of Apopka, FL, and his brother, James (Kazuco) Riscinti of Altamonte Springs, FL. Tom is also survived by his sister-in-law, Jane Riscinti, and two nieces, Rachael Riscinti and Giavanna Riscinti of Altamonte Springs, FL. He is also survived by his beloved dog and guardian angel Daisey.
